### Meet the Congregation: Calvin Roy

Calvin Roy was born in Racine, Wisconsin on February 18, 1925. He moved to Milwaukee with his family when he was three years old, and lived there until his senior year of high school. In 1943, he was drafted in to the U.S. Navy. He was sent to Radio Technician School—which, in spite of its name, actually provided training in radar technology-- at Texas A & M. He served on a destroyer for six months, until he was sent to Officer's Training at Ohio State University for a year.

He left Ohio for Illinois, where his parents were living at the time, to finish his college degree at Augustana College in Rock Island. From there, he went on to Grace Theological Seminary, where he studied for nearly four years, followed by an additional year at Conservative Baptist Seminary in Denver, Colorado.

After pastoring at a church for a year, he entered the Air Force Reserve as a chaplain for another year, before accepting a position at Tampico Baptist Church in northern



Illinois, which was in a small farming community of about 700 souls. He still writes to the current pastor, who was a 5-year-old boy in his congregation back in 1955! Although he enjoyed pastoring at the Tampico church, he received orders to go on active duty with the Air Force, and was sent to Davis Mountain AFB in Tuscon, Arizona, where he served as chaplain for three years. He went to Japan in 1958, and also made three trips to Thailand while serving overseas. From Japan, he was sent to Panama City Florida in 1962. After leaving Florida, he spent two years in Goose Bay, Labrador, ministering to the men working at radar installations along the Atlantic seaboard.

Cal finally arrived in California when he was sent from Canada all the way out west to serve at Edwards AFB. He didn't stay here long, however, being quickly sent to Vietnam; first in Saigon, then to the north. He retired from his military career in 1976, retiring to the southern California town of Ramona, where he spent three years building himself a house. It was there at the church in Ramona that Cal met his second wife, Leona. Together they moved to our part of the state in 2001; first to Pollock Pines, and five years later to Somerset. He began attending Pioneer Bible Church when Mike Sciarra, a friend of Pastor Jim's who was serving at Voyagers Bible Church in Irvine, California, recommended PBC to Cal through their mutual friend Gary Stubblefield, who is married to Cal's daughter.

Cal and his wife Leona have 11 children between them. Cal has 5 grown children with his first wife, Earlene, and Leona has 6 children with her first husband, Earl. Cal spends most of his free time reading and studying, while Leona enjoys gardening, sewing and crochet. He has led a Bible study class at PBC ever since 2001, when he began filling in for Dick Tolles, and has taught it continually through the present day. The class is currently meeting during the Sunday school hour (10:00 am-11:00 am) in the library. The topic is an examination of the gospels entitled "Life of Christ."

"The best advice in the whole world is that the Bible is true," he says when asked what wisdom he would share with young people. "Believe it. Leona and I read the Bible together every morning. We read through the Bible each year. She's read through it seventeen times—once each year since we've been married!"

# Drop by the Clothes Closet!



Pioneer Bible Church is home to a wonderful ministry, one that serves people from all backgrounds and walks of life: the clothes closet! Under the direction of Kate Bila, the clothes closet provides clothes of various types and sizes, from children's wear to maternity, professional wear, and winter jackets and blankets, all free, to anyone!

Karen had some great contacts in town, with Calvary Chapel and Jordan's Closet Consignment, and I was happy to be the grunt worker! After gaining permission, we began distribution

on Wednesdays."

When asked what the goals of this ministry are, Kate replies: "To meet the clothing needs of anyone in our community, and to do so with love and generosity, and a 'God Bless You.' Some establishments choose to limit what people take each time, but we have always stood firm in the belief that God will truly supply all our needs."

Kate tells us that sorting and storage space are constant challenges. Currently, Joanne Wilson and Priscilla Jeuchter are regular volunteers. "Over the years, we have had several different volunteers work from time-to-time. Some folks can only ever come work once, and that is okay too!"

Anyone interesting in volunteering in this important ministry should let Kate know. "There is plenty to do! I can always use extra help. The work is physically exhausting and time consuming." Also, "I almost always say 'yes' to more donations, because there are always needs, especially men's clothing. And prayer is always appreciated!"

The clothes closet is open the second Wednesday of each month, through that Friday. (Closed Thursday in summer.)
