

### In the News

After being detained for two weeks for attempting to distribute gospel tracts in North Korea, John Short, 75, was released by North Korean authorities on March 2. The Australian missionary, who resides in Hong Kong with his wife, had traveled to Pyongyang as part of a regular tour group on Feb. 15. The following day, he was questioned about the gospel tracts and subsequently detained. Upon his release, he was flown to Beijing, where he was met by officials from the Australian embassy. He is expected to return to his home in Hong Kong. At least two foreign missionaries, including American Kenneth Bae

#### Pioneer Community Preschool Update

Our preschool program is in jeopardy of being cut due to the budget, and as a matter of legality, the district gave me a "pink slip" (effective at the end of this school year.) At this time, I am doing everything to spread the word that this wonderful program exists in our community. If enough students can be enrolled for the fall, the district can rescind the pink slip. We are also looking for outside funding support. It is my prayer that the district can find a source of support that enables many more families to be able to afford preschool for their children. The district is looking at grants, federal supplemental programs, and other options. There is also a piece of legislation currently being reviewed that will provide preschool in the state's elementary schools.

Prayers are welcome for the well-being of this preschool program. It has been my "baby" since 2009 and it is breaking my heart to have to once again fight for something I believe is so essential, especially in our community where there are so many who would benefit. This is a personal ministry for me. When I moved to this county in 2000, my children attended Head Start and State Preschool and through their experiences and growth in these programs, I was moved to take college courses toward my Early Childhood Education credential. for learning with the youngest members of our school community.

It's not about my job, it's about the program and the children and families it serves. God has given me a sense of peace about my situation and a purpose to promote and spread the word in the hopes to keep this going. The school board is in a difficult position, they unanimously agree on the benefits and need for our preschool and do not want to close the doors. That being said, I am grateful for their support, but the bottom line from a budgetary standpoint is that the program must become self-supporting to continue.

# **Crisis Response Training**

In March, I was able to attend four days of training down at Bayside Church in Rocklin. This training was suggested to me by Pastor Jim, who, with his wife WilleJune, has taken the training himself in previous years. There are four main components to the program, which can be described as: the individual one-on-one component (sometimes called "emotional & spiritual first aid"), critical incident stress management (group intervention), understanding grief & trauma, and suicide intervention. At the Rocklin seminar, each component was a two-day, 8-hour per day class. Two classes were being offered simultaneously, so it wasn't possible for me to complete more than 2 components this time around.

First, I completed the C.I.S.M. class, where I learned (and practiced!) how to properly conduct a debriefing. The goal is to help people understand what happened and begin to think clearly after a traumatic incident such as a natural disaster, terrorism, or an act of workplace violence. I was taught what the physiological manifestations of stress are, how to asses them, and how to recognize if a person's post-traumatic-stress is becoming problematic and requires professional mental health intervention.

Second, I completed the class intended to help caregivers & aid workers understand grief as it occurs in a traumatic context. It was an emotionally challenging experience, as we learned about the stages of grief and its effects on the mind. We even learned the basics of death-notification, and how to help someone get through the experience of

identifying the remains of their loved ones, which are skills I sincerely hope I will never have to put to use! Although I enjoyed the wonderful instructor, Jennifer Cisney Ellers, and made new friends in the class, I was glad to get home to my family after that final, emotionally draining day!

I'd like to thank the congregation for their patience with our reduced office hours during that second week of March, and especially the ladies (who know who they are!) who took on the role of receptionists for me so I could relax, knowing the office was in good hands. I am grateful to work at a church that invests in my on-going training and professional growth.



# **Child Sponsorship Matters: South Africa**

This month is the beginning of autumn In South Africa! That is where 18 year old **Nobihle Zorrbo** lives, a young woman sponsored by members of our church.

Nobihle is part of the Okhahlamba Area Development Program. (Located in the bright-green shaded area on the eastern side of the map.) With support from sponsors like Nobihle's, World Vision was able to accomplish the following at the Okhahlamba ADP in 2012: trained 172 community members in sustainable agriculture; formed two garden cooperatives; provided training to 30 community health workers on the management of childhood diseases; organized 11 awareness campaigns to help community members know their HIV status; worked with the Philakahle Wellbeing Center to raise awareness of the importance of breastfeeding & immunizations to improve child health; provided 1,200 children with life-skills education; partnered with local churches to organize discipleship studies; collaborated with the Okhahlamba Christian Council to organize prayer days, and also to provide children with needed clothing .... And that's only a partial list!
