Throughout the months of May & June, the church will be participating in Shoes for Orphan Souls, a drive to collect new athletic shoes for poor and orphaned children.

The project was begun by PBC member Rich Lepera, who tells us, "I heard about it on [radio station] K-LOVE. They did a big shoe-drive. It was laid on my heart, and I prayed about it, and it came to fruition!"

Shoes for Orphaned Souls began as Shoes for Russian Souls in 1995 by KCBI radio in Dallas, Texas. Buckner International, a Christian group established in 1879 to make life better for orphans and widows worldwide, took over the program in 1999 and changed its name to reflect its broader reach. Since 1999, more than 2.3 million pairs of new shoes and socks have been distributed to

#### Dina Panasiuk's Surprise Melt-Aways

"I make these a lot," said Dina. "Every Christmas and Easter my son has to have them!"

1 cup butter or oleo 1 8-oz pkg. of cream cheese 2 cups flour preserves or filling powdered sugar

Cream together butter or oleo, cream cheese and flour. Refrigerate for at least 2-3 hours. (Overnight is perfect. Can be kept in a tightly sealed container for up to 2 weeks.) Roll out just as if you were making a pie crust, 1/8" thick; cut in trapezoid shapes. Spread your favorite preserves or filling in the center of each trapezoid & fold over two ends. Bake on ungreased cookie sheet for about 10 minutes at 350. Sprinkle with powdered sugar.
