Back to Babylon!


Every year, kids get together here at Pioneer Bible Church for a week of fun and games with a purpose. This year Vacation Bible School lasted from July 9th-July 13th. It was open to kids from four years old to children entering the sixth grade.

The church was decorated to look like ancient Babylon to help the children learn of God's faithfulness through the story of Daniel. At the opening of the day, all the kids gathered together in the sanctuary for a group assembly, which included worship music, a missionsfocused presentation, and teaching. From there, the children split into "tribes" to spend time doing activities including crafts, music, skits, outdoor games, and having snack.

Kids were given neck-chains which they could decorate with beads they earned for attendance and participation. They also were given pocket cards with scripture for them to memorize. Jamin Eggert Serves in Uganda

Anyone attending a service here at PBC during the month of July would not have missed the drive to collect toiletries and first-aid products for Jamin Eggert's mission to Uganda. He will be in the country from August 3rd- 18th.

"Uganda is a small, East African country on the Equator and is about the size of the state of Oregon. Its Lake Victoria feeds the headwaters for the Nile river that runs North to Egypt! For twenty four years this region of Africa has faced the Lord's Resistance Army, a militant group under Joseph Kony that has kidnapped as many as 100,000 children for warfare and displaced between 1.8 and 2 million people. I went three years ago with a team to encourage restoration through counseling and training for the community leaders. We have created an orphanage, called the "Children's Village" outside of Lira, where the kids are fed, taken to school. and learn about Jesus, but have no medical history or regular medical care. That's where we come in!"

You can help by praying for: "<u>Team safety.</u> We are eight nurses and two guys in a postconflict country. Pray for protection and safety of our team. <u>Supplies</u>. We are carrying in thirty boxes of supplies, clothes, tools, hygiene kits, gloves, scrubs, etc. We've been warned that security in country may illegally tax/confiscate if we're known as a medical team. Pray that correct officials should know our purpose and protect us from illegitimate ones."





<u>Pray for our orphanage kids</u>! Their hearts, teaching, faith and health. Pray for the surrounding kids! As many as 100 will be included in our team. Pray for them! We've been invited to view surgery, <u>pray</u> for Dr. Opio and his staff as we visit. <u>Our team unity</u>. A team of medical professionals has very difficult schedules, we've still never met as a complete team. <u>Pray that Jesus would reign</u>, that there will be graciousness and love between one another and lots and lots of patience."

ESTHER DAWSON'S MACARONI SALAD (You may have tasted this dish at the after-VBS barbecue!)

16 oz uncooked elbow macaroni
1 pound cherry tomatoes, quartered
1 cup frozen corn, thawed
1 medium green pepper, chopped
1 small red onion, chopped
2 ¼ ounces sliced ripe olives, drained
½ cup lime juice
¼ cup olive oil
1 Tbls red wine vinegar
1 Tbls chili powder
1 Tbls ground cumin
1 tsp sugar
1 tsp salt
1 tsp garlic powder

Cook pasta according to package directions; drain and rinse in cold water. In a large bowl, combine the pasta, tomatoes, corn, peppers, red onion and olives. In a jar with a tight-fitting lid, combine the lime juice, oil, vinegar and seasonings; shake well. Pour over pasta mixture; toss to coat. Cover and refrigerate for 1 hour or until chilled. Yield: 16 servings
