In an effort to facilitate a smoother transition from worship into the sermon, the elders have decided to make changes to the order of events on Sunday morning. Please note the service times have not changed!

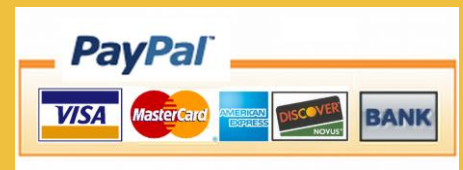

An Update from Don & Mary Grable

“We enjoy being part of the team ministering to the boys and girls who attend the Good News Club every Wednesday 12:45 – 2:30 pm at the Vallejo Bible Church. The Lincoln Elementary School is just one block away from the church. Part of the team walks up to the school and brings the children down to the church. We have the class and then the children are walked back to the school. They sing some songs, have a Bible story, memorize a Bible verse and have lunch. They say the Bible verse they learned to the hearers, Don Grable and Norman Reece. They get to choose a prize from the gift table if they have said the verse. We give them such a short time. We pray that the Word of God will penetrate into their thoughts and change their lives for God. It is a vital ministry and we are thankful to be part of it.”

“Another ministry we take part in is the sing-a-long ministry at the Springs Road Health Care Center, on the second Friday each month from 3:45-4:45 pm. It is good to see these dear people each month. They love to sing the precious old hymns. Once in a while I hear from them telling how the Lord has worked in their lives...” “We have been doing this for about three years. The Lord led Carol White to start this ministry. She was in a care facility for a time in Santa Cruz. Some people came to the place with this type of ministry and she was captivated by it. When she got well and was in Vallejo, she and I stopped at this care home and asked about starting this ministry. We were given the green light. Carol asked several of us to help her and we have been doing it ever since. Praise the Lord for the opportunity to serve Him.”

4H Shooting Sports Update

Clayton Holmes was recently notified that he has been selected to the California State 4-H Shooting Team for Shotgun. He, along with his team mates, will travel to Nebraska this summer to compete at the National 4-H Shooting Sports Invitational. This event hosts thousands of people from across the U.S. at one of the country's toughest and most sought after competitions for youth.

There are 9 different disciplines the youth will be competing in: Compound Archery, Re-curve Archery, Air Rifle, Air Pistol, .22 Rifle, .22 Pistol, Shotgun, Muzzle-loading, and Hunting Skills. This event will be California's first venture to the national competition held in Grand Island, Nebraska, and the team is already hard at work raising funds. They have set up a GoFundMe account and are actively working on other fundraising projects.
