Devotional: We Are the Temple by Sandy Hanson

"Now arise, O LORD God, and come to your resting place, You and the ark of Your might."

These were King Solomon's words at the closing of his prayer of dedication for the temple of the LORD which he built according to his father, King David's instructions, recorded in 2 Chronicles, chapter 6.

While reading this passage it occurred to me that the New Testament tells us that believers are now the temple. Solomon asks of God, "May your eyes be open toward this temple day and night, this place of which you said you would put your Name there." Replacing the words 'this temple' and 'this place' with the personal pronoun 'me' throughout this passage was very significant for me. If you decide to read this chapter, keep this in mind - it might speak to you as well.

Throughout the passage Solomon relies on God's mercy and goodness as he prays boldly, over and over, that God would bless the people of Israel in spite of themselves. Solomon predicts Israel's unfaithfulness yet appeals to God to 'hear from heaven and forgive' numerous times. Here is just a sample: When your people have been defeated because they have sinned and when they turn back and confess your name then hear from heaven and forgive the sin of your people. When the heavens are shut up and there is no rain because your people have sinned and when they pray toward this place and confess your name and turn from their sin then hear from heaven and forgive.

When your people are taken captive, if they have a change of heart and turn back to you, then hear their prayer and forgive your people.

Solomon covers all the bases: When famine or plague, blight or mildew, locusts or grasshoppers, when enemies besiege them... WHATEVER DISASTER OR DISEASE MAY COME--when a prayer is made BY ANY OF YOUR PEOPLE...then hear from heaven ... forgive. I admire Solomon's boldness in what I interpret him as saving: WHATEVER DISASTER if ANYONE calls out to you Lord, then hear from heaven, send help and forgive us! Then it occurred to me that this is Solomon's prayer - in other words, these are Solomon's words not the Lord's. These are his requests, his wishes, his words. God didn't make any promises here. It is just Solomon speaking his hopeful heart's desire. HOWEVER, in the next chapter, 2 Chron, ch 7, God responds! And He says the most wonderful, gracious things! He says, "I have heard your prayer and have chosen this place for myself (remember to insert a personal pronoun for 'this place'!) ... continued on page 4

I have chosen and consecrated this temple so that my Name may be there forever." It just boggles my mind that the God (who made the world and everything in it) would agree to all the terms (the man) Solomon set out. But He does agree! Not only that, He supersedes Solomon's requests by promising the sweetest promise of all. Our loving Heavenly Father makes this promise in regard to His temple, "My eyes and my heart will always be there."
